BCE (Big Creative Education) is a creative arts college in Walthamstow, East London. We offer a wide range of vocational courses in areas such as Music, Media, Performing Arts, Fashion, Games Design, Animation, Events Management, Art and Design, and Sports. In addition to this, BCE provides T-Level courses, Apprenticeships, and Traineeships.

Students graduate with vocational qualification, maths and English qualifications if not previously achieved, a professional portfolio and other essential materials, equipped with the skills necessary for further education, an apprenticeship, or direct employment.

The college's tutors are dual practitioners, meaning they are not only educators but also active professionals in their respective industries, providing students with real-world insights and up-to-date knowledge. BCE offers learners access to work experience opportunities both locally and abroad, industry-set briefs, enrichment trips, and more, giving them hands-on experience and a deeper understanding of their chosen field.

BCE has three campuses in the Blackhorse Road area, which offer an array of courses and levels from Entry Level 3 to Level 3. Big Creative Training is situated at Uplands House and our Digital Future Campus, while Big Creative Academy can be found on Clifton Avenue.

Our SEND offer

BCE specialises in supporting all learners, including those with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), to achieve qualifications and advance in their careers, all within an inclusive learning environment.

Once at BCE we will also ensure that reasonable adjustments are in place to enable students to have fair access to assessments and exams, to achieve their full potential and qualifications.

Learners will receive additional support as needed, for example access to extra numeracy and literacy sessions, counselling, wellbeing classes, or speech and language therapy.

Learners with SEND join our mainstream courses and are free go offsite at lunch and break times.

We look forward to you joining BCE in the next academic year.



Here is a step-by-step guide to the application process if you have SEND:

1

Come along to an open evening!

The SEND Team is always at hand at open evenings to discuss any requirements.

At the open evening you will have the opportunity to tour our facilities, meet our tutors, and have an interview with a tutor for September. You will then be guided to a specialist SEND Officer for an initial assessment.

2

Provide full details

When you apply to BCE please ensure you provide us with full details of any special educational needs and disabilities or medical needs you may have, so that we can put the best possible support in place during your time studying of us.

We will also ask you to tell us about any support you have had in the past and share any important paperwork e.g. your EHCP, pupil plan, access arrangements or formal diagnoses.

Please tell us if you are currently involved with any additional services, for example the social care team. We will need to know if you have a travel buddy or any other service that accompanies you to and from education.

Please give us all the information you can that will help us understand your needs.

3

Initial assessment

We will arrange an initial assessment with our SEND team (which may include a literacy and numeracy assessment). This is to ensure we find the right course that meets your needs.

We will request information from your parent or carer, school or previous education establishments, support providers and other relevant professionals to make sure that the appropriate support can be put in place.

If an EHCP has been issued, BCE will require a formal consultation to be made by your local authority SEND Department, this will ensure that your needs can be met at BCE. This consultation is required to complete your application.

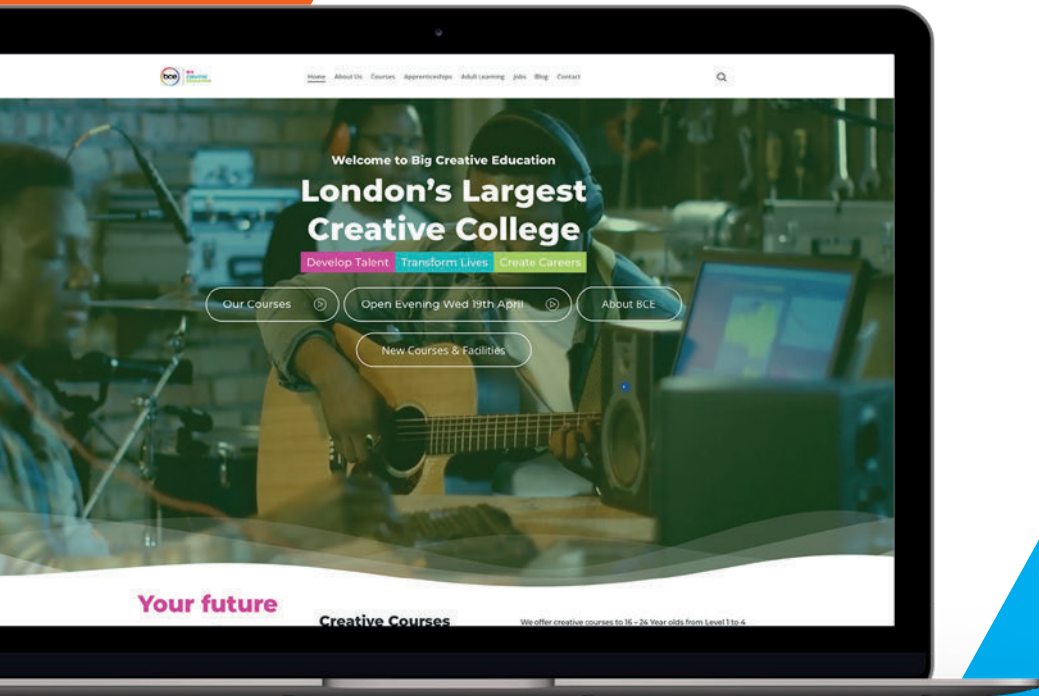

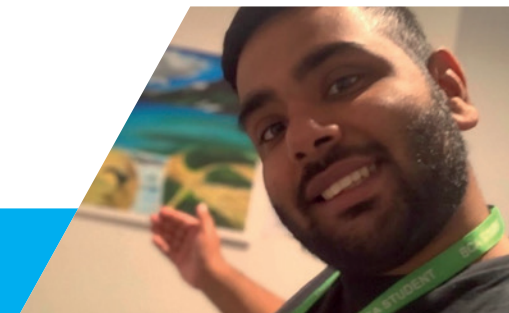


What our students say

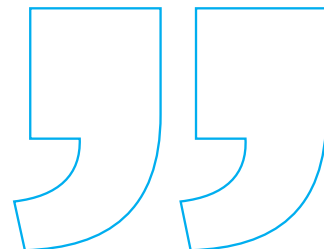

Entry requirements

Entry Level

You must have the aptitude and ability to complete qualification specification (main qualification) and assignments within the creative tasters. You must be working towards Entry Level 3 in English.

Level 1

2 or more GCSEs at grade 1 plus English at Entry Level 3 or above (or equivalent).

Level 2

3 GCSEs at grade 3 or above including English (or equivalent).

Level 3

5 GCSEs at grade 4-9 including English (or equivalent).
